13 AN ORDINANCE RE-ESTABLISHING THE EMERGENCY SERVICES COMMISSION
14

15 WHEREAS, the Fairbanks North Star Borough did not reauthorize the
16 Emergency Services Commission and the time lapsed therefore the Commission is
17 inactive, and;
18

19 WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Fairbanks North Star Borough Assembly
20 that this Commission be reinstated.
21

22 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Assembly of the Fairbanks
23 North Star Borough:
24

25 Section 1. Classification. This ordinance is of a general and permanent nature
26 and shall be codified for a period of six years.
27

28 Section 2. Chapter 2.30 Emergency Services is hereby re-established as
29 follows:

31 **Chapter 2.30**
EMERGENCY SERVICES

32 Sections:

33 2.30.010 Commission – Established.

34 2.30.020 Functions and duties.

35 2.30.030 Termination.

36 **2.30.010 Commission – Established.**

37 Within the department of emergency operations there is established an emergency
38 services commission consisting of seven members to be appointed by the mayor and
39 confirmed by the assembly. Members shall be appointed with due regard for their
40 interest and expertise in the planning, support and delivery of emergency services.
41 Members shall serve without compensation.

43 **2.30.020 Functions and duties.**

44 The commission shall:

45 A. Evaluate all areawide, non-areawide and service district services provided by the
46 Fairbanks North Star Borough, in the fields of communications, ambulance, rescue and
47 related medical services, fire service, emergency management, disaster planning and
48 response, civil defense and hazardous materials response.

49 B. Review the facilities, capital equipment, volunteer and financial resources and
50 long-term plans available to the borough for the delivery of emergency services.

51 C. Hold public meetings throughout the borough to elicit input from citizens
52 concerning desired levels of services and costs for delivery of all emergency services
53 and concerns of equity to remote areas of the borough.


54 D. Develop criteria to be followed for equitable delivery of services within the borough
55 to reflect findings of investigations, and formulate a long-term plan to guide efficient and
56 economical delivery of quality services in the borough.

57 **2.30.030 Termination.**

58 The commission established in this chapter shall terminate upon completion of a long-
59 term plan and adoption of same by the assembly, unless affirmatively reestablished or
60 continued by the assembly.


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62 Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance shall be effective at 5:00 p.m. of the
