Section 5.

- Assembly Climate Action Committee. The Assembly hereby Section 6. establishes the Climate Action Committee as a special committee of the Assembly.
 - One member of the Assembly and five members of the public, selected by 1. the Presiding Officer, and the mayor or designee will serve on the Climate Action Committee. The Chair shall be selected by the Presiding Officer.
 - 2. The purpose of the Climate Action Committee shall be to identify necessary tasks and develop an appropriate Climate Action and Adaptation Plan for a second-class borough and recommend a Climate Action and Adaptation Plan to the Assembly for adoption.
 - The Climate Action Committee shall be afforded the opportunity to review 3. and make meaningful input into the procurement documents prepared to select a contractor to draft a Climate Action and Adaptation Plan. Such input shall be accepted unless the chief procurement officer determines that it is inconsistent with FNSBC Title 16 or standard procurement practices. The Climate Action Committee shall also appoint a majority of any selection committee used in the procurement process. In addition, the Climate Action Committee shall be afforded the opportunity, to the extent consistent with FNSBC Title 16 and any contractual obligations, to determine whether the contract should be modified, terminated or extended.
 - The Climate Action Committee shall meet at the call of the Chair. The 4. committee shall sunset upon its recommendation of a Climate Action and Adaptation Plan for consideration by the Assembly.

Section 7. Effective Date. This ordinance is effective at 5:00 p.m. on the first Borough business day following its adoption.
